

FAST TIME AROUND THE WORLD.

GEORGE FRANCIS TRAIN BEATS THE RECORD, BUT HE IS IN BAD HUMOR.

TACOMA, Washington, May 24.—George Francis Train, accompanied by S. W. Wall, arrived here via the Union Pacific Railroad at 6:45 this evening, completing the fastest trip ever made around the world. He left here March 18 last, and was gone 67 days 13 hours 3 minutes, and 3 seconds; but his actual traveling time was over thirty-six hours better, he having stopped of his own volition that length of time in New-York, arriving there last Sunday morning and not starting for Tacoma until Monday morning.

His actual traveling time, therefore, from Tacoma was 65 days 1 hour 3 minutes and 3 seconds, beating Nellie Bly's time about seven days and five hours.

Train is very bitter against Tacoma. From her champion and friend he has turned to bitter denunciation of the people for their failure in providing him a special train from Portland to Tacoma via the Northern Pacific. That railroad declined to furnish
